Member Show and Tell

We had a lot of stuff from the members this month!

We'll start with a Be-6 from Andrew R. Andrew built this some time ago. The Be-6 model is a 72nd scale Flugzeug-Modelbaukasten kit purchased in 1978. The kit was

Andrew had to scratch build one of the ailerons. This was a very simple build with no interior. Andrew fogged the windows to hid the interior as a result. It took Andrew two days to build and finish the kit using tube glue and rattle can paint.

Rick R completed the Wingnut Wings Sopwith Snipe.







This kit was built out of the box with the exception of E-Z line used for rigging. IN order to simulate castor oil staining from the engine, Rick applied acrylic hairspray to the wings and tail and allowed to to dry. Then he applied a darker coat of clear doped limen and then used a stiff brush to clear away the darker paint until the desired result was achieved.

Rick also brought his Zoukie Mura Ki-45. A 32nd scale effort.





Although a marvelously detailed kit. There are fit issues and unnecessary seams that need to be addressed. Fit issues especially in the engine nacelles and the rear (aft of rear cockpit) fuselage where seven seams need to be addressed, instead of one seam. Modeling skill definitely required for this build

Joe G. brought along his Trumpeter 72nd scale F-105G.



Earl showed us his Roden Junkers D.R. 1. Primary complaint of this kit is nothing fit!!



Herb presented his 35th scale Tamiya Horch 1A Flak 38 kit. The signs in the vignette are from Model Victoria. Herb used various shade of desert yellow and some panzer gray (both from Tamiya). This kit won 1st planned best armor at the IPMS Region 12 show in 2018.



Dayne Taylor brought along to 100th scale Gundams. These took months to build and it shows in the details. Dayne did some scratch building with each kit. Paints used for each included AK, Mr. Hobby, Tamiya. The Africa Corps Gundam (on the right) also used epoxy and Ammo paints. The Africa Corps effort also included simulating simmered, cast armor texture, and some metal bits.





Rick Davis brought in a Sherman vignette, "Rescuing the Rescuers" diorama, and a mule hot rod.

The 1/35th scale Sherman took about two months to build and is painted in a medium green. The kit went together very well and Rick added the boxes and gear.

The USMC 1/35 scale mule was used to haul cargo and weapons. It took Rick about a week to build. The engine is a 350 Chevy with Hooker Headers.

The tail section and crew of the Hu-16 Albatross (72nd scale) came from the Revell kit. Rick made the water and spotted it with black paint to simulate oil. He highlighted the wave caps with white to simulate foam.

Phil C. Showed us ho Tiger Werke Vietnam era ammo bunkers used at Fire Support Base Ripcord in July 1970. These held ammof for 105mm and 155mm howitzers. Master were made, rubber molds were poured from the master, and then the reason was cast.



Finally, Phil S showed us his diorama of a Tyrannosaurus rex-VW bug face-off with two unfortunate human beings in between.
