## Minutes from the November 16, 2019 Meeting

- Meeting was called to order at 11:00AM. A short "Meet and Greet" took place. Welcome our newest member Rick Reinert.
- The topic to host the 2020 Region 12 Show and Convention was discussed. After considering all aspects of hosting a show, it was decided the club is not in a position to host a show given the short time period of the club's existence. Hosting the 2021 Region 12 Convention & Show was entertained, voted on and a vote of YES was received. When the time is appropriate another vote will be taken to verify the club's previous vote of yes, then a proposal will be submitted to the Region Coordinator.
- The club decided that our next club build would be "Bust". Jim and Joe are finding a source and will let the group know at the December 14<sup>th</sup> meeting. It was also decided a 90-day time frame for completion. As our last group build was judged by one of the librarian staff, we would also follow the same procedure.
- Annual dues were collected from members.
- The club had its first annual "Stash & Swap Meet 50/50" November 16, 2019 after the
  general meeting. Attendance was excellent. Members were able to unload quite a few
  kits not planned for future builds. Not only were the members able to recoup some of
  their expenditures, but the club's purses were substantially increased to the tune of
  \$157.00.
- Chris Aranda with the U. S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Myrtle Beach Vet Center gave a presentation to the club on partnering with the area vets. Members agreed that this avenue of approach would be a worthy pursuit. Members would mentor deserving vets in their modeling skills. Mr. Aranda will direct the partnership along with a contact member from the club.
- Increasing the annual dues was brought to the floor to be voted on. Without objection the dues starting in 2020 would increase to \$20.00 annually.
- Additionally, a vote was taken on increasing the raffle tickets from \$1.00 to \$2.00 was voted on and passed.
- The tour of the USS North Carolina ("Behind the scenes") is still on to be scheduled for the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> week in January. Phil Sicard is following up and will let the group know the exact date and time. An email will be sent at that time.
- The members entertained the idea to have a Christmas Party at the December 14<sup>th</sup> meeting. The party will include a White Elephant exchange and snacks/refreshments. An email will be sent with the rules for the White Elephant Exchange to the members will detailed information.

- Jim Fraboni is working with the Socastee Public Library to use the glass showcases in February 2020. A separate email will follow.
- Rick Reinert has volunteered to give the club an Inservice on the judging criteria from IPMS/USA. January 2020 will be the 1<sup>st</sup> Inservice scheduled. A big thanks to Rick.
- Monies collected from raffle, dues and 50/50 from the "Stash" sale totaled \$285.00.
- Meeting was adjourned at 2:00PM.





## **Notable Historical Facts – Armistice Day and the Poppy**

## **Veterans Day**

On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 an armistice between Germany and the Allied nations came into effect. On November 11, 1919, Armistice Day was commemorated for the first time. In 1919, President Wilson proclaimed the day should be "filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory". There were plans for parades, public meetings and a brief suspension of business activities at 11am.





An Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) was approved on May 13, 1938, which made November 11 in each year a legal holiday, known as Armistice Day. This day was originally intended to honor veterans of World War I. A few years later, World War II required the largest mobilization of service men in the history of the United States and the American forces fought in Korea. In 1954, the veterans service organizations urged Congress to change the word "Armistice" to "Veterans". Congress approved this change and on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor all American veterans, where ever and whenever they had served.

The **poppy** was chosen as the symbol of Remembrance because poppy flowers grew on the battlefields after the end of the First World War. A poem widely shared around Remembrance Day, In Flanders Fields, helped create the legacy of the poppy as an important symbol of sacrifice and duty.

#### In Flanders Fields



To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high.
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders fields.

Quote from Abraham Lincoln's second inaugural address in 1865. President Lincoln affirmed the government's obligation to care for those injured during the war and to provide for the families of those who perished on the battlefield.






