Minutes Grand Strand Scale Modelers

February 19, 2022

We lost a great modeler, Rick Davis. As a remembrance, we have established the Rick Davis Best Marine Subject Award for BeachCon.

New Business

No new business was discussed.

Old Business

After a brief discussion it was decided the due date for the 1/700 watercraft build will be the April meeting instead of the March meeting.

Rick provided a quick review of our financial status, which was also in the newsletter.

All other discussion was on Beachcon 2022.

Rick (Update on show)

1/2 of the fees for the location have been paid.

At least one award sponsor (Newburn) has committed.

Phil Sicard is holding and organizing the raffle items. Ed's Hobby and GT Resin have already agreed to provide items and other sources are interested.

Rick Reinert distributed flyers at JAXCON and has flyers available for distribution by members.

There was discussion on judging and two main points were "clarified": Members can enter models in the contest and judge. They **CANNOT** judge categories in which they have items entered. To be clear, a judge cannot judge their own model.

Members are requesting a training session on judging before the event. (See trial run suggestion below)

Rick Reinert passed around an award coin from JAXCON, similar to what we are expecting to award at BeachCon. The members agreed a stand would be nice to distribute with the coins. Joe Baxter will produce two versions of stands for the next meeting (March) and a decision can be made then. A means of "attaching" a date (2022) would be nice, however to allow the coins to be reused or remolded without a "setup" cost it was suggested we look into a label on the back or bag.

Phil is requested to investigate club T-shirts to allow some new members to be "properly" attired at the event.

Joe Baxter will bring a sample name tag for members at the March meeting. It is expected there will be approximately 20 "crew" at the event. 6 from Columbia and 10 to 12 from Grand Strand.

Phil Cavender will coordinate with food vendors.

There are at least 3 areas that need clarification:

Is there adequate parking at the facility (how many spaces)? Should members carpool to save space? Is there a PA system provided and if so where is it located? Does the facility have restrictions on banners (advertising)? If so what are they and how do we inform vendors?

Saturday October 1 08:00 Doors open (Do we want to announce 08:30 for the public so we and the vendors can get organized?) (Alternate can we get access to the facility at 07:30?)

08:00 Contest registration opens (depends on public hours)
(Do we want to allow setup crew to pre-register and position their models
e.g Friday to increase their availability on Saturday?)
09:00 Contest opens
12:00 Contest registration closes
12:30 Judging starts
15:00 Judging ends
16:00 Awards announced
17:00 Event closes to public (Tear down, do we want to allow early tear down by vendors?)
(When can contestants remove their models?)

18:00 Facility closes





Chaz Chorazewitz brought in A Special Hobby He-162






Chaz also brought in a 72 scale Renault FT-17.
