Meeting Minutes March 18 2023

The monthly meeting was held at the Socastee County Library starting at 10:00 AM. There were **20** members present.

- Rick led the discussion on the pending BeachCon 23 event on the 25th of March. Planned and final assignments were discussed as were registration processes. All were asked to help setup on Friday (24th) after 2pm, be at the venue on the 25th by 8am and asked to help tear-down after the event.
- All GSSM BeachCon entrants were asked to bring their entries on Friday to test documentation and placement within the venue.
- Dayne & Phil S. presented the primary times (10am, 11am, and 1pm) for raffle pulls. Further pulls would be performed as it becomes necessary.
- The remainder of the meeting included discussions pertaining to BeachCon 23 and Show/Tell.

Treasurer's Report:

The Treasurer's report was given by Phil Cavender. Closing balance was \$1534.56.

The View from the Top / GSSM's President's Perspective

First off, BeachCon 23 was a great success. We had 87 entrants and 417 models on the table. I found the quality of the work on display astounding. Some really top-class models. For next year, we will set up the contest a bit different. We have already reserved an additional room at the Reed Rec Center so we can place the vendors into their own dedicated room as well as having dedicated space for the model display area. IF anyone has any more recommendations, please bring it up. The feedback has been good so far. We were mentioned on the Plastic Model Mojo podcast as being a good show. With good vendors. Race City IPMS used our show as a comparison for theirs (in a positive way).

Some other things I would like to see is more demonstrations on how to do various modeling techniques. Some things that come to mind are cleaning up seams, black basing, dealing, wood grain. If you would like to see a demo please speak up.

New Discussion Topics for April:

T-Shirts with Options:

Earl & Chaz have been focused on a new T-Shirt/Polo purchase with options. The plan is to have T-Shirts available in black, navy blue, and charcoal grey. 
Dayne Taylor – 1/48 ZVEZDA SU-57

I was greatly looking forward to this event because due to a number of reasons, (Covid cancelletions, illness, other entangelments), this was the first large con I had been to in several years.

Before I left I was able to use the information filled website to get all pertinent info I needed and fill out and print my paperwok. That meant once I arrived all I had to do was fill in one number on each page and pay my entry fee.

On arrival I found this is the first con these guys have put on and having gone through a similar experience in 2022 I say well done, guys. You did a fine job.

The number of entries were high and, interestingly, the build mix favored automobiles heavily. As would be expected the quality of models displayed was extremely high and it was a delight to see excellent new models mixed in with familiar builds from our show last year.

I was certainly impressed with the fact that builders had come in from as far afeild as St. Augustine, Florida and West Virginia. And three of the winning builders were women!

I volunteered to help with the judging and was on Rick Reinert's

We could then rationally and fairly compare the build quality and finish of each remaining entry to come to a final decision. There was a goodly number of vendors with a fine variety of product on display. Prices were good and from the feedback I have gotten from the vendors I have spoken to they were happy with how the show treated them. There were even some reps from manufacturers on hand.
