The View from the Top / GSSM's President's Perspective

I thought I would give a quick trip report about the Nats. A Thorns and Roses approach follows:

Roses:

- 1. The kits on the table were for the most part very well done. I personally thought that the best of show was a scratch built motorcycle, that in one word was stunning. But, the judging team saw that differently and chose a WWI howitzer that was installed on a tractor transport. This kit was also very well done.
- 2. Judging was, I thought, mostly fair, at least with my team. Although there are a lot of complaints about the judging on Facebook, I think it is better to take these criticisms with a grain of salt. As some of the complaints sure seemed like sour grapes to me. I judged a few categories, one in particular was late war Me-109 G6's or later. Talk about a specific category! It was easy to eliminate most of the 109s based on wonky gear or an alignment issue. But it was very difficult selecting the best three. Although we ultimately chose what I thought were the correct winners. I am convinced that if we judged those same models on a different day, or if a different judging team were to look at them, a different set of winners would be chosen. Just goes to show how subjective judging is. If you want to improve, the best way to do so is by judging.
- 3. I took the airbrush class offered by Grex airbrushes. This class is really for beginners and I would recommend it if you are a beginner or think you could brush up on the basics. Otherwise, your money is better spent in the Vendors Rooms (all three of them). Grex had some great swag, including a great deal for an airbrush/air pump set up.
- 4. Pacific War Museum in Fredericksburg. Definitely worth a visit. Remind me to talk about Admiral Nimitz and Admiral Togo at the meeting. They were acquaintances prior to the war.
- 5. Lewis Air Legends all flyable aircraft here, and F3F-3, two Tigercats, an F-86, a P-39, a Huey Cobra (Vietnam), a few Bearcats, and the P-38 Glacier Girl.
- 6. Vendors Some vendors were reasonably priced, I picked up an HK Models B-25J (48th scale) for \$99, including a Squadron walk around book at Squadron Hobbies. Yes, it looks like Squadron is making a comeback and is priced to be competitive.

Thorns:

- 1. Upon entering the event hall, there were a fewer registration tables. Although there were folks ushering us into one of many lines. The process was a bit slow, mostly due to all of the attendees arriving at once. The thorn is that although I was registered, there was no registration package there for me. Although this eventually got straightened out, it was a pain waiting for closure. Not exactly sure what caused this, but it may have been due to the fact that Gary from Coastal Carolina registered me as assisting him as a vendor.
- 2. The modeling tables were too close together. It was difficult to navigate, especially during judging.
- 3. Some folks don't listen. The judges briefing was pretty straightforward. "Don't pick up the models!" And yet, you see it often. Also, some judge dropped a flashlight onto a kit breaking off a propeller on a beautiful A-20G Havoc.
- 4. Vendors Some vendors were very expensive, and there were very few deals to be had on Wingnuts. Did I say very expensive. One Hobby Shop vendor there was stepping on the prices

unto 40%. I was in line to buy a HK Models B-25J (48th scale). On sale for \$140. I fortunately went to the Sprue Brothers web site and saw it for \$99 before I purchased and walked away. They would not match prices.

Herb railroaded a French Panhard into an Eastern Front Spähwagen!


Some modifications were necessary to take the standard ALBY Panhard 178 Draisine to ride the rails!!






Joe is next with a Tamiya 48th scale Mitsubishi in Japan Naval colors! Hey, what are those guys doing in that box? Can't wait to see the result!

If you've never seen this before you can utilize this conversion chart to scale a full-size item to an appropriate scale. Might want to keep it in your back pocket or computer for future use!!

Simply.....Amazing!!!



Most of us are aware of using Oven Cleaner, or Brake Fluid, to remove enamel paint....or that crappy chrome that comes on the car kits....BUT, what about acrylic paints?

I recently acquired a pretty rare kit but the thing (completely unbuilt) was covered in acrylic paints!! Not wanting to use gallons of rubbing alcohol I happened to read how Simple Green could be used to easily remove acrylic paint from plastic parts. It was assumed that the sprues had no hard primer, so I gave it a go. In a short amount of time the acrylics dissipated off the sprues as hoped. A soft toothbrush handled the rest. The tracks were painted in enamel paint, so some Oven Cleaner was needed as well but ALL the paint was removed from the kit sprues!!

AS a bonus, it's been said that Simple Green is handy in cleaning your airbrush of acrylic paint as well. Ya really can't beat the price!! Give it a go!! Just make sure you dilute the concentrate.




