Meeting Minutes October 22, 2022

Grand Strand Scale Modelers

The meeting was called to order at 11:00 AM with eighteen members present including one new member. Please welcome Duncan Bare whose main interest is modeling and sculpting figures.

Our annual dues were collected amounting to \$300.00 which does not include a few members who will pay in November and December.

BeachCon 22 / BeachCon 23 was moved to Saturday, March 25, 2023, with setup Friday evening March 24, 2023. Same location and same hours. The movement in date was directly due to Hurricane Ian arriving on the Grand Strand on September 30, 2022. The venue location was closed as were all Horry County Public Facilities. No loss of money was involved to the Club. The tables for the show were sold out and thirty-six out of sixty award categories were paid for by various clubs and individuals. Refunds were offered to the vendors or to transfer to the March 2023 show. There were only three (3) vendors requesting refunds totaling \$430.00. These vendors will be contacted next month giving them an opportunity to vend in 2023. Even with the refund, the show income/expense report showed a positive of \$201.71. A new category was added to the award listing. "Best Avro Lancaster" People's Choice Award.

Eighteen (18) members are taking part in the Airfix 1/72nd Scale Avro Lancaster club build in addition to twenty (20) members from the Coastal Carolina Scale Modelers IPMS/USA chapter in Charleston, SC. Kits were donated by Stevens International. A big thanks to Mike for having the contact. The category will be Out-of-box with the additional opportunity for each member to use other markings or decals. Judging will be at the BeachCon 23 show as a "People's Choice" award. The design for the award can be seen in this newsletter.

The new dates for the upcoming club meetings are November 19, 2022, in the classroom, December 17, 2022, in the meeting room, and January 21, 2023, in the classroom. December 17, 2022. Instead of a regularly scheduled meeting, December 17 will be the club's Christmas Party. All members are asked to bring a covered dish. The meeting in December is our annual PotLuck and Gift Exchange

Rules for White Elephant Gift Exchange

- 1. If you would like to participate, bring a wrapped, modeling-related gift. This can be most anything from a kit, to supplies and tools, to reference materials. It is important that your gift is wrapped, though. You may, if you want, put a "from" tag, but the "to" will be up to fate and your club mates!
- 2. All of the gifts are placed together and everyone who is participating will draw a number, 1 through the total number of participants. This number will determine the order that participants will select a gift from the pile.
- 3. In numerical order, starting with number 1, participants will select a gift. The gift MAY be selected from either a. The pile of wrapped gifts... OR b. An unwrapped gift was already selected by one of the other participants. (In the competitive vernacular of some of your club mates, option "b" is called a "STEAL"!)
- 4. If another participant selects the unwrapped gift that YOU already have (i.e. they "steal" your gift), you MAY select again from the wrapped gifts OR "steal" another unwrapped gift from someone else! If you "steal" a gift, that loser MAY also exercise either option, select a wrapped gift or "steal."

Note that any gift may only be "stolen" once per round. So, if the prize you have your eye on has already been stolen once that round, it is "safe" with the current holder until the next round. If not, though...Don't be shy... "Steal" it!

- 5. This process continues until someone finally selects the next wrapped gift from the pile, which is unwrapped for all to see.
- 6. After the next wrapped gift is selected and unwrapped, the next participant in numerical order gets his or her chance following rule 3 above, to either select another wrapped gift or "steal" an unwrapped gift.
- 7. The cycle of selecting, stealing, and unwrapping continues until everyone has had their turn.

But wait! It's not over yet...

8. Since number 1 only gets to select from the pile of wrapped gifts, the last round goes back to him or her. Number 1 can either stand pat or "steal." If he or she stands pat, then then the game is over.

However, if he or she "steals," number 1's old gift goes back on the table, and the loser gets to either select number 1's old gift or "steal" it from someone else. Remember, any one gift can only be stolen once per round, so the final round continues until someone selects number 1's old gift, or every other gift has been stolen once leaving the final loser only one option, number 1's old gift on the table.

Sounds complicated, I know, but it is not, and there is a lot of scheming and strategizing to try to manipulate the stealing (for all the good it does!), and bragging rights often go to the person who brought the most desirable gift (i.e., the gift that was "stolen" the most). It really is a fun time.

In any case, mark your calendars for Feb. 10/11th, 2023 for JAXCON 2023! More info will follow this fall as details develop!




